Frequently Asked Questions

How long is the programme?

The 12-month programme will begin in September 2026 (online) and be delivered over the following months, culminating in a final in-person gathering in September 2027.

What are the dates & times? What is the time commitment overall?

- **Global Majority Leaders:** 4 days in person, 18 hours online - [see dates schedule](#)

You are expected to attend all elements both on-line and in person of the track you apply for.

For the in-person elements, will food and accommodation be paid for?

Yes, we cover all food and accommodation during the 3-day residential for the Global Majority track in October 2026, and for everyone at the final gathering event in September 2027.

Am I eligible to apply if I live outside the UK?

You must live in the UK to take part in the programme.

How will my travel costs for the in-person element of the programme be covered?

We expect that your organisation will pay for your return travel to the in-person elements of the programme. However, we realise that this can be difficult for some, particularly smaller, organisations, so we have some bursaries available for return travel to the October 2026 residential and final gathering in September 2027. If you are accepted onto the programme you can apply for a travel bursary.

Regarding the reimbursement of travel, you will pay for your ticket and then request reimbursement after you have attended the in-person element of the programme. We will reimburse travel costs on submission of a valid receipt/ticket and a completed travel reimbursement form. We will only pay for second class travel.

My organisation would like to submit multiple applications – is this possible?

What is a Global Majority Leader?

A Global Majority Leader refers to individuals who are racialised as Black, Asian, Brown or Arab. We are asking those that apply to this track to be operating at mid-management level or above and navigating leadership pathways within the sector.

What is Leading Beyond Authority (LBA)?

Many successful leaders learn to lead in roles or circumstances where they have clear authority, budget and accountability. When they move beyond this – leading peers, partners and stakeholders – the skills that brought them success may not be enough.
